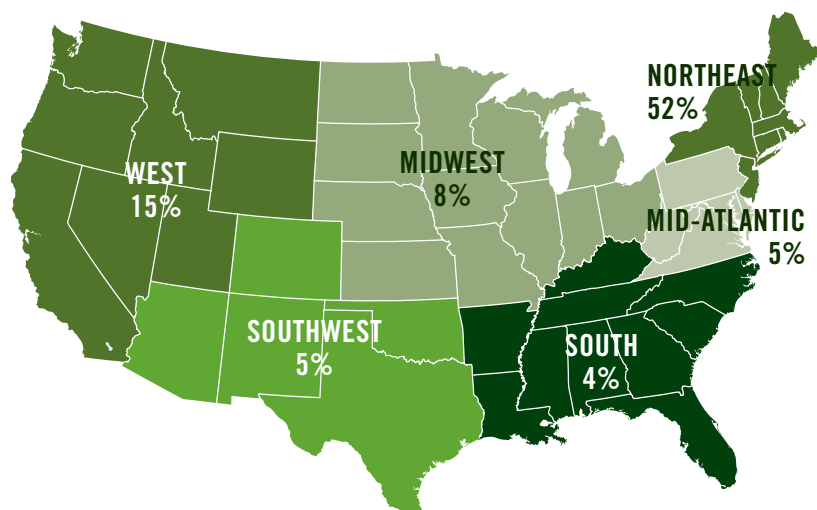

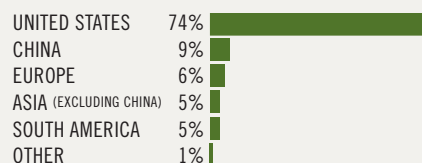

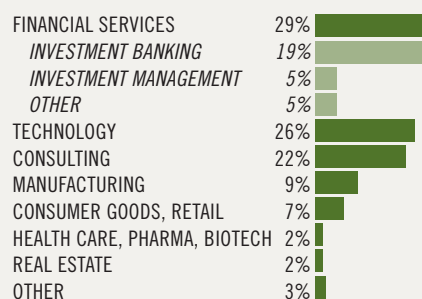
### INTERNATIONAL T'16s, BY REGIONAL LOCATION

### INTERNATIONAL T'16s WORKING FULL TIME OUTSIDE THE U.S., BY INDUSTRY



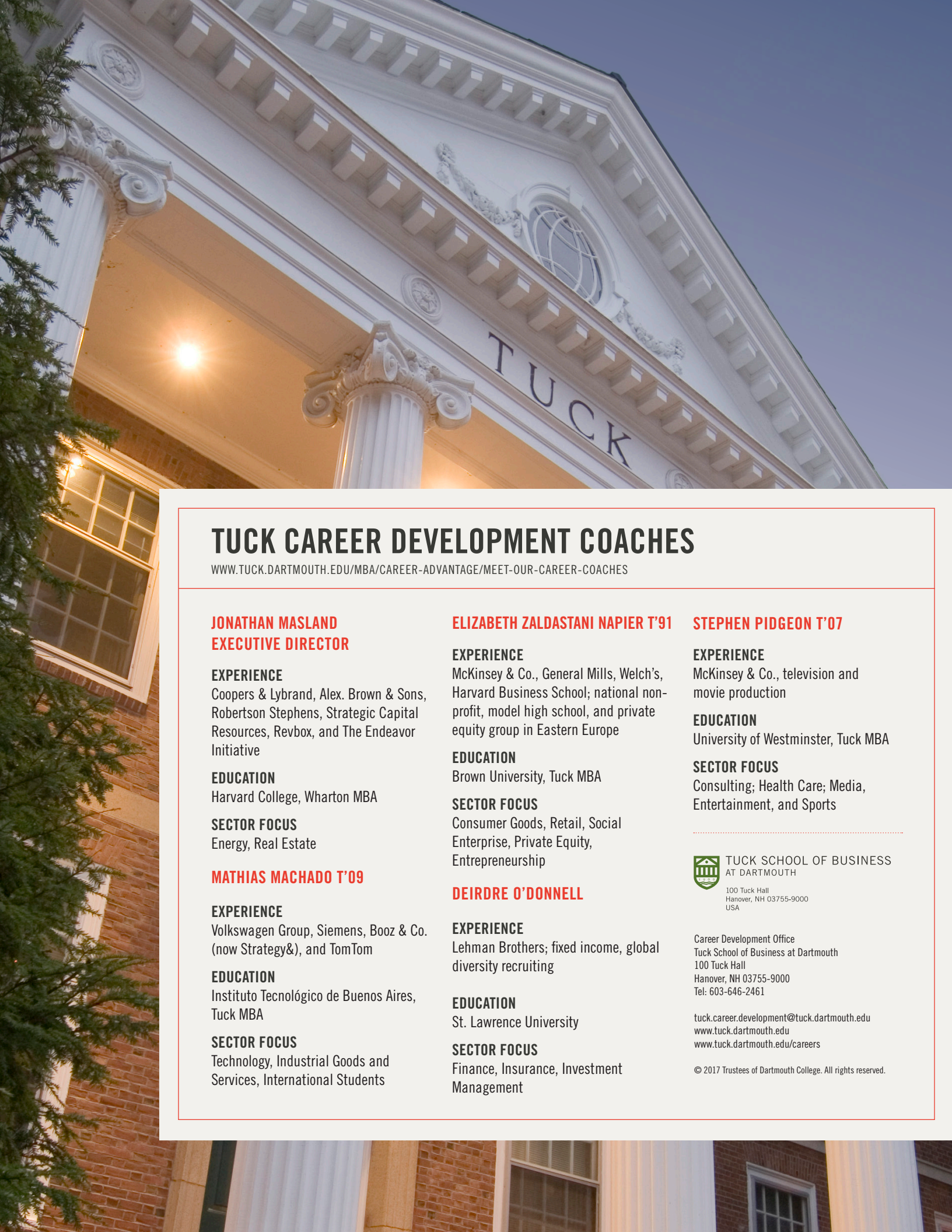
