



# MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The top firms in the world continue to seek the wise, decisive leaders we develop at Tuck, as evidenced by the continued employment success of our recent MBA graduates.

For the second year running, Tuck has had the highest rate of accepted jobs at three months post-graduation among top business schools: 98 percent of the class of 2021 received a job offer within three months of graduation—approaching the school record of 99 percent—and 97 percent accepted an offer within the same time-frame, the highest percentage of acceptances in school history.

These are compelling, highly-compensated offers from the most sought-after companies in the world that set our graduates off on



the right foot as they begin their post-MBA journeys. First-year compensation for the class of 2021, for example, was strong. Median total compensation for Tuck's T'21s is \$180,000, sustaining last year's record high. The median first-year base salary is \$150,000 and the median signing bonus is \$30,000. The mean first-year base salary and signing bonus is \$176,464, with 86 percent of graduates receiving a signing bonus.

Another exciting element of employment results for the class of 2021 is the diversity of career paths and industries graduates entered. While the top three industries for Tuck graduates continued to be consulting, financial services, and technology, for the second year in a row, the triumvirate of health care, pharma, and biotech closely followed the top three industries—13 percent of Tuck graduates secured roles in these sectors, up from 8 percent a year ago. Seeing an increased interest in the health care industry is especially encouraging, as it's a sector full of opportunity where Tuck MBAs can make a real difference. For the top industries, 36 percent of our recent graduates secured roles in consulting, 23 percent in finance, and 15 percent in technology.

Meanwhile 100 percent of our first-year class, the class of 2022, had at least one internship, spanning industries: from consulting, investment banking, and private equity/venture capital, to technology, health care, and energy.

With our personalized approach to career support, vast corporate network, and the world's most responsive alumni network at our fingertips, it's no wonder Tuck continues to experience the highest rate of employment success among business schools.






